**BACKGROUND:** Of the nearly 4,000 ODPS employees, 414 of these employees are active military personnel or veterans, with more than 135 employees serving as members of the National Guard and Reserves. The ODPS Military Committee was created to develop methods that improve the quality of life for departmental citizen soldiers, airmen, sailors, marines, coast guardsmen and their families during periods of peace, pre-deployment, deployment, and post-deployment. Recently, ODPS received the U. S. Secretary of Defense Employer Support Freedom Award, the highest U.S. Government recognition to employers for support of military employees who serve in the National Guard and Reserve.
